

### **RECTOR'S NOTES**

#### **GENERAL VESTRY**

There will be a meeting open to all parishioners on Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> March in St Peter's, immediately following a shortened service of Morning Prayer at 11am. Everyone is welcome to come along. Please note that the date has changed from what was publicised in the previous Parish Notes.

At the meeting you will hear reports from the Honorary Treasurer and myself, and you will have an opportunity to ask any questions, raise concerns, or make suggestions about any matters relating to the parish.

Most importantly, the new Select Vestry will be elected for the forthcoming year. The only people who will be allowed to vote, or to stand for election, will be the 127 individuals whose names are listed on the Register of Vestrypersons. That list is printed elsewhere in these Parish Notes and on the notice board at the back of the church. If you believe that you should be entitled to vote, but your name is not listed, then please contact me as soon as possible so that we can check our facts.

All registered members will receive a voting card in the next few weeks. To speed up proceedings at the meeting, please bring the voting card and a pen with you. Do not write anything on the card until instructed to do so at the meeting.

The following officers will be elected (or appointed) at the meeting:

- 2 Churchwardens, who are the lay leaders of our congregation;
- 2 Glebewardens, who oversee the care of our buildings;
- 3 Supplemental Parochial Nominators, who will deputise the Parochial Nominators;
- 4 Sidespersons, who will assist and deputise the Churchwardens (as necessary).

We will also elect the following representatives to various committees:

- 12 members of the Select Vestry, who will manage our staff, buildings, and finances;
- 3 members of the Finance & Administration Committee;
- 3 members of the Fabric & Furnishing Committee.

Even if you are not entitled to vote, please do come along. Tea/ coffee will be served, and there will be a crèche for children. Hopefully we should be home by 1pm at the very latest!

#### FAMILIES' & CHILDREN'S WORKER

During the last couple of months you might have noticed a new person helping with our children on Sunday mornings. That person is Frank Dillon, who has been appointed as our new Families' & Children's Worker. This part-time position is funded by the St James' Endowment Fund "for experimental ministry".

Frank's role will be primarily pastoral and liturgical in nature. He will assist me in discerning and addressing the spiritual needs of parents and children, within the context of Sunday worship, weekday parish activities, and within the home. He will also lead informal worship aimed at children in the Main Hall on the second Sunday of each month. Please note that it probably won't happen in April simply because of the date of Easter. This Family Service will take the place of Sunday School, so children should be brought as normal to the church at the beginning of the 11am service, and I will invite them to go to the Main Hall after the Introduction.

Frank has already begun to visit families at home. This will be done by arranged appointments, rather than casual pop-ins. What I want from these visits is for you and Frank to get to know each other, and for Frank to hear from you some feedback on what we're doing right in terms of developing the ministry of children and the ministry to children, and where we need to improve! Frank will then feed that back to me, and we will try to develop these important ministries.

There are various other ideas that we will begin to implement once Frank is settled in, and I will keep you posted on what's happening. Please do give him all of your support and encouragement.

#### **DISCIPLESHIP COURSE**

After Easter I will begin offering a three-session Discipleship Course for our parishioners. (This is not an evangelistic mission designed to bring newcomers to us, as that will be our focus next year.) The intention is to bring all of our current members up to speed about basic Christian teachings, to give an overview of the history and purpose of the Church, and to provide a friendly and informal opportunity to ask questions and search for answers.

Each of the three sessions will be held at various times of day, over the course of the year. Some people might want to attend three sessions in a row in the same month; whereas others might want to attend one session every few months. As a consequence, there might be ten people at one session that you attend, but only two at the next! It doesn't matter so long as everyone comes along at some point. I'll say more about this after Easter.

#### **CHURCH SERVICES IN MARCH**

We are now into the season of **Lent**, which is a penitential season during which we reflect upon our sinfulness, but – more importantly – we remember that God will forgive all who are truly sorry. Some people like to give up something, such as chocolate. I think it would be much better for us spiritually if we all did our best to be in church every Sunday! Let that be our spiritual challenge for the coming weeks.

Our traditional services of **Choral Evensong** will be held at 6.30pm on Sunday  $1^{st}$  March and Sunday  $15^{th}$  March.

On Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> March there will be a **Family Service** in the Halls. This will take the place of Sunday School, and will be an informal gathering of children and their parents, and indeed anyone else who might prefer less formal worship. It will be led by Frank, our new Families' Worker. Everyone should congregate in the main church as usual for 11am, before being invited to go to the Halls.

Our **Easter Vestry** meeting is normally held on a weekday evening, which sometimes prohibits parishioners from attending. This year, as an experiment, we will have a shortened half-hour service of Morning Prayer at 11am on Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> March, which will then be immediately followed by the Easter Vestry meeting. Everyone may stay for the meeting, which will be held in the church. (In the last issue of the Parish Notes I had written that this meeting would be held on Palm Sunday, 29<sup>th</sup> March, so please take note that it has now been brought forward by a week).

At 7.30pm on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> March we will celebrate **St Joseph of Nazareth** using the traditional-language service.

At the very end of the month we will move into **Holy Week.** This will begin with Palm Sunday and end on Easter Day. There will be a service every day except the Saturday. During the weekdays there will be a service each evening at 7.30pm. On Fig Monday there will be Compline. On Holy Tuesday there will be Evening Prayer. On Spy Wednesday there will be a Late Evening Office. On Maundy Thursday there will be Choral Eucharist. On Good Friday there will be Tenebrae. We will also have a regular celebration of Holy Communion on Wednesday morning and a children's service on Good Friday. More information will be given in our weekly notices sheets and on our Facebook page. Many parishes have stopped having mid-week services during Holy Week because of falling attendance. We want to keep our ancient customs alive in St Peter's, so please make a special effort to come along.
