#### **SERVICES IN NOVEMBER**

November begins with All Saints' Day. During the evening on that day, our regular service of Choral Evensong will be replaced with a service specifically tailored to enable us to reflect upon, and give thanks for, loved ones who we have lost. The names of individuals buried through the parish since last year will be read aloud, and we will all have an opportunity to light a candle in memory of our dearly departed.

Remembrance Sunday falls on the 8th November this year, and as usual we will have a solemn service at 11am with the laying of wreaths and a two minute silence. Please note that there will be no Family Service in the Halls, and instead the children will go to Sunday School to learn about the meaning of Remembrance Sunday.

There are only two Holy Days in November: All Saints' Day on Sunday 1st November, and St Andrew's Day on Monday 30th November. Another important day will be the Kingship of Christ on the 22nd November, which marks the last Sunday of the current liturgical year. During the evening of the last Sunday of the month, the 29th November, we will also have our Advent Carol Service.



We have been delighted over this last month with all that has been going on with our families' and children's ministry. The children really enjoyed the Big Kids Adventure in Cloughfern Parish, even the parents had a great time with us. The Big Kids Adventure is a diocese-wide children's programme that is full of fun activities, craft and teaching. We had four of our kids there and two parents who helped me supervise, all in all, it was a great success.

A weekly Homework club has also been started in the halls on a Monday afternoon and has been running for four weeks now. Although we are starting small and slow, we are hopeful that it will grow and benefit the community and schools around us. Please encourage people you know with kids to bring them along to it as we have found that it really helps relieve some of the pressures of homework, for both parents and children. We would love to see more families take advantage of this.

As ever, I am available for pastoral visits so if you are a family with children please get in touch if you would like me to come along and pray with you and your children, or if you want to discuss church or other related matters. My contact details are on the inside back cover. Coming up to the Christmas period I will be visiting families that belong to St Peter's to keep up to date and to offer any support necessary.
