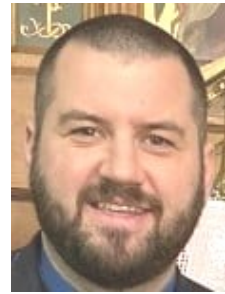
Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols Monday 18th December at 7.30pm

RECTOR'S NOTES



SERVICES IN DECEMBER AND JANUARY

On behalf of the Select Vestry and congregation of St Peter's, may I wish you and your loved ones a very Merry Christmas! Please make every effort to worship in St Peter's on either Christmas Eve at 11pm or Christmas Day at 11am.

On 3rd December, the **First Sunday of Advent**, there will be a Family Service at 10am at which we will make Christingles, followed by a service of Advent Carols and Readings at 11am. That evening, at 6pm, there will be a service of Choral Evensong for Advent.

On 10th December, the **Second Sunday of Advent**, there will be Morning Prayer at 10am, followed by Choral Matins at 11am.

On 17th December, the **Third Sunday of Advent**, our Nativity Service will be at 11am. Note that there is no 10am service on this Sunday, nor on subsequent Sundays until February.

On Monday 18th December, our service of ***Nine Lessons & Carols*** by candlelight will be at 7.30pm.

On 24th December, it is the **Fourth Sunday of Advent** up until dusk, when it becomes **Christmas Eve**. There will be a service of Choral Matins at 11am, and Midnight Communion at 11pm later that night.

On Monday 25th December, it is **Christmas Day**, and there will be a celebration of Holy Communion at 11am.

On 31st December, the **First Sunday of Christmas**, there will be a service of Morning Prayer at 11am. This will be led by Jonny Watson, who was our Student Reader earlier this year. Our guest organist will be Julian Moller, the son of the late Very Rev'd Brian Moller.

On 7th January, the Sunday after the Epiphany, better known as the **Baptism of our Lord**, there will be a celebration of Holy Communion at 11am. This will be led by the Rev'd Alan Millar.

On 14th January, the **Second Sunday after the Epiphany**, there will be Choral Matins at 11am.

On 21st January, the **Third Sunday after the Epiphany**, there will be Choral Eucharist at 11am.

On Sunday 28th January, it is the Presentation of our Lord in the Temple, better known as **Candlemas**. There will be a Service of the Word at 11am.

In addition to those Holy Days already mentioned, **St John's Day** will be celebrated during our midweek service on Wednesday 27th December.

LAY MINISTRY APPRENTICE

I am delighted to announce the appointment of Robert Long as our part-time *Lay Ministry Apprentice*, paid for by the St James' Endowment Fund. Robert is a member of the parish of Rathcoole, where he has held various roles in recent years, including Churchwarden, Honorary Secretary of the Select Vestry, and Parish Reader. Some of you will already have met Robert as he has attended our mid-week Holy Communion on a number of occasions in recent weeks, as well as the monthly Discipleship Group. He also led Morning Prayer at 10am on Sunday 19th November, and assisted me afterwards at the 11am celebration of Choral Eucharist. You will continue to see him in

St Peter's most Wednesday mornings and also on one Sunday morning each month, but his primary role will be to provide pastoral support to parishioners throughout the week, either at home or in hospital. I will ask him to write a little about himself for the next issue of the Parish Notes. Please make him feel very welcome in our community.

DONATIONS IN CHURCH

After a baptism in St Peter's not long ago, one of the godparents asked me if we had a card reader in the church on which he could make a donation. How I laughed! And then I realised he was serious, and that it is probably a facility that we should offer, given that fewer people carry cash with them, and even fewer keep their cheque book in their pocket. Accordingly, we now have a card reader sitting beside the offering box at the back of St Peter's! It is straightforward to use: You simply enter how much you would like to donate on the display panel, and then tap your card against it. This is a useful tool for visitors to the church, but for regulars I would suggest continuing to use FWO envelopes or standing orders, as donations through the card reader might not be included within your total giving for the year. (There is a way around this by entering your details on the display panel, but that might prove cumbersome to you if done repeatedly throughout the year.)

DISCIPLESHIP AND BIBLE STUDY

In our previous sessions of the monthly **Discipleship Group**, we have considered what the Bible reveals about salvation and the afterlife, and we have thought about how to articulate our faith. This month we will think about "*Christian heresies and how to avoid them!*" You will be very welcome to join us. We begin at 7.30pm on Thursday 7th December in the Minor Hall.

On Thursday 14th December, our **Bible Fellowship** will meet for the last time this year, and we will have some festive treats to enjoy!

On Thursday 21st December, particularly for the benefit of those who cannot attend church in person, there will be prayers and Bible study online using **ZOOM**, at (the slightly earlier time of) 1pm.

FESTIVITIES

There will be various Christmassy events happening in the coming weeks which I heartily encourage you to come along to.

On Friday 1st December at 8pm, St Peter's will host a Christmas concert by the **Cavehill Community Choir**. Tickets cost £10, and will support Friends of the Cancer Centre, Sands, Air Ambulance, Prison Fellowship NI, and Tear Fund.

At 10am on Sunday 3rd December, we will be making **Christingles** at our Family Service. If you like oranges and sweets, then make sure to be there!

On Saturday 16th December, there will be **Afternoon Tea** in the Lansdowne Hotel. Tickets cost £5 per adult. There is no charge for children. If you would like to attend, please contact Daphne at daphnemcclements@stpeterbelfast.org or sign the sheet at the back of the church.

On Sunday 17th December, our **Nativity Service** will be at 11am. This is a simple re-telling of the Nativity Story, with both pre-recorded and live action involvement of the children. You can see some of the dressing-up during rehearsals in recent weeks on the front cover!

On Monday 18th December, **Nine Lessons & Carols** will be held at 7.30pm. This is always a popular service for ourselves and other members of the local community.

There will be a **Christmas Party** in St Peter's on Wednesday 20th December at 11.30am, following our mid-week celebration of Holy Communion. There will be tea, coffee, and a selection of sweet and savoury food. This is absolutely free to anyone from the local community, but numbers are limited. CONFESSION IS GOOD FOR THE SOUL

If you reflect seriously upon the Ten Commandments, it won't take you long to work out that all of us have broken most of those laws at some point in our lifetime, and that humanity in general has certainly broken every single one of them. It has always been this way: If much of the first half of the Old Testament consists of laws that the ancient Israelites were instructed to live by, then much of the second half consists of the prophets condemning them for being disobedient.

To a certain extent it's understandable, then, that some people are put off reading the Old Testament, for fear of being immersed in – what they might consider to be - doom and gloom, in which we are repeatedly being reminded of just how awful we are.

But there is a very good reason why our sinfulness is emphasised in the Bible, and why by extension I need to preach about it, and it has nothing to do with trying to make you feel bad about yourself. In fact, quite the opposite.

To explain this, let's look at the opening words of the traditional service of the Church of Ireland's service of Morning Prayer: "Dearly beloved brethren, the Scripture moveth us in sundry places to acknowledge and confess our manifold sins and wickedness; and that we should not dissemble nor cloak them before the face of almighty God our heavenly Father, but confess them with a humble, lowly, penitent, and obedient heart, to the end that we obtain forgiveness of the same by his infinite goodness and mercy."

Notice that last line: “To the end that we obtain forgiveness ... by his infinite goodness and mercy.”

So the reason why it’s important to be aware of our sins, is that this is the first step – not in being condemned for them but rather in being set free from them.

Of course, that probably seems to be counterintuitive. It’s like walking into a police station and confessing a crime, and the police write down your statement, and then they throw it in the bin and tell you that you’re free to go. That wouldn’t happen in everyday life, and you wouldn’t expect it to – as we’re programmed to expect some form of negative consequence whenever we admit that we’ve broken the law. We expect to be rebuked for it, or punished for it. And so we feel safer keeping our mouths shut. Say nothing, and nobody will find out.

But that notion doesn’t work in Christianity, because God knows your sins. He is aware of them whether or not you tell him about them. So, the question is: why then do you need to confess? If God knows, why bother?

Well it’s not about informing God. Rather, it’s about taking ownership of your mistakes. It’s about putting your hands up and saying to God, “I know I’ve done what I shouldn’t have. I know I haven’t done what I should have. And I’m sorry. Going forward, I want to do things differently. I want to behave the way you want.”

God’s response to that, rather than the anger and condemnation that we would expect, is actually mercy and forgiveness. And that’s why the message that Jesus proclaimed, and what he has achieved for us through his death on the Cross, is called the Good News. It is good, because by admitting our sins, and trusting in Jesus, our sins are forgiven, and we are set free. Free from the guilt and consequence of past sins, and free to live as the children of God.

This is the ultimate form of healing – to be at peace within yourself, with the people around you, and with God.

PAUSE FOR THOUGHT AND PRAYER

“For unto us a Son is born”

Can you imagine the scene in the fields near Bethlehem 2,000 years ago? The shepherds out in the fields watching over their flocks, just like every other night, maybe chatting among themselves, or walking about to keep warm. It is so quiet, perhaps the odd bleat of a restless sheep, or a sleepy shepherd snoring, or a wild animal not too far away. It would be a ‘dark sky’ with stars beyond counting. No danger of light leakage there. (When did you last see the Milky Way?) Then their ordinary night changes abruptly. “An angel appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified.” Might we not all have been terrified? The angel brought them, these humble shepherds, the good news about Jesus’ birth in Bethlehem, the town of David. All this amazing news was followed by a great company of the heavenly host appearing with the angel, praising God and saying, “Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favour rests.” It was not to the rich and those in authority in the temple that God chose to announce the good news, but to the lowly and the rejected in society. God’s son brought healing for all nations, no-one is excluded or found unworthy of healing. All who ask are forgiven; the door is open to all. It is God’s gift to us all, which we will soon be celebrating. But for many people Christmas is a sad time. It is a day to be ‘got through’. Speaking only for myself, my greatest comfort and support are in church, sharing with the people the joy of the good news brought to us by a tiny baby. I will try to imagine that scene when it was first announced that Jesus came to save us.
